## bunTe Wole ANTTENNA

A simple, beginner-friendly hat for a head circumference of about $57 \mathrm{~cm} / 22.5^{\prime \prime}$ or $60 \mathrm{~cm} / 23.5^{\prime \prime}$, with rolling brim and optional "antennae" detail at the top.


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## Instructions

CO 88 or 92 sts. Join for knitting in the round, being careful not to twist. Knit until your work measures $17 \mathrm{~cm} / 6.7^{\prime \prime}$ or $16 \mathrm{~cm} / 6.3^{\prime \prime}$ from the CO edge.You may find it helpful to have a marker at the beginning of the round.

Crown decreases:
The decreases for the larger size start earlier, i.e. after $16 \mathrm{~cm} / 6.3^{\prime \prime}$ :
*k21, k2tog the next 2 sts*, repeat 3 more times $=88$ sts

Starting at $17 \mathrm{~cm} / 6.7^{\prime \prime}$ height, decreases are now identical for both sizes. Place a marker at the beginning of the round if you have not already done so before.

Round 1: *k20, k2tog*, repeat 3 more times $=84$ sts
R 2-4: knit 3 rounds without any decreases
R 5: $\quad$ *k19, k2tog*, repeat 3 more times $=80$ sts
R 6-8: knit 3 rounds without any decreases
R 9: $\quad$ *k18, k2tog*, repeat 3 more times $=76$ sts
R 10-12: knit 3 rounds without any decreases
R 13: $\quad$ *k17, k2tog*, repeat 3 more times $=72$ sts
R 14-15: knit 2 rounds without any decreases
R 16: $\quad$ *k7, k2tog*, repeat 7 more times $=64$ sts
R 17-18: knit 2 rounds without any decreases

R 19: *k6, k2tog*, repeat 7 more times $=56$ sts
R 20-21: knit 2 rounds without any decreases
R 22: *k5, k2tog*, repeat 7 more times $=48$ sts
R 23: knit 1 round without any decreases
R 24: *k4, k2tog*, repeat 7 more times $=40$ sts
R 25: knit 1 round without any decreases
R 26: *k3, k2tog*, repeat 7 more times $=32$ sts
R 27: *k2, k2tog*, repeat 7 more times $=24$ sts
R 28: $\quad * \mathrm{k} 1, \mathrm{k} 2$ tog $*$, repeat 7 more times $=16$ sts
R 29: k2tog 8 times $=8$ sts

If you do not like the "antennae" detail, finish here as follows:
Cut yarn, leaving $20 \mathrm{~cm} / 8^{\prime \prime}$. Using a tapestry needle, run the yarn through the remaining 8 sts (preferably twice) and pull the opening close. Weave in yarn from the inside.

The "antennae" are worked as icords, using 2 dpns.
Place 4 sts on a holder or separate thread. Transfer the remaining 4 sts to a dpn.
Using the other dpn, k4. Do not turn, but push the right-hand dpn (which bears these 4 sts) to the left. Using the free dpn, knit these 4 sts again, pulling the working thread tightly around the back. Repeat until you have about $9 \mathrm{~cm} / 3,5^{\prime \prime}$ or as much length as you like. Stretch or massage the icord a bit from time to time to make it look more even. When you like the length, cut the yarn, leaving about $20 \mathrm{~cm} / 8^{\prime \prime}$, pull it through the 4 sts, pull the opening close and weave in inside the cord.
Repeat for the other "antenna", starting from the 4 sts that were placed on hold before. Leave a slightly longer tail as you cut the yarn this time and use the remaining tail to also close the gap between the 2 cords.

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[^0]:    Yarn about 60g Soft Donegal by Studio Donegal, $100 \mathrm{~g} / 190 \mathrm{~m}=208 \mathrm{yds}, 100 \%$ pure wool Needles and Notions

    2 circular needles and/or 5 dpns, size 4-5mm (whatever gives you the correct gauge)

    Tapestry needle
    1 stitch marker
    Stitches used
    Knit only, in the round
    Gauge
    16,5 sts / 27 rounds $=10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm} / 4 \times 4^{\prime \prime}$
    Abbreviations
    $\mathrm{CO}=$ cast on, sts $=$ stitches, $\mathrm{k}=$ knit, $\mathrm{R}=$ round, k2tog $=$ knit 2 sts together
